Ayurvedic procedures like Kshara sutra, agnikarma, raktamokshana etc. are also commendably performed.

Ancient procedures like agnikarma are performed in an innovative manner. Ex. Agnikarma is performed with the help of modified Instrument, a electricity heated shalaka with sensor for measuring the temperature at the heated tip.


